

**COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS
CITY OF ATTICA**

3-9-2026

The Common Council for the City of Attica met on March 9th, 2026, at 6:00 P.M.

Those present at the meeting were: Council Members, Mrs. Kaylie Carnahan, Mr. Jim Poynter, Mr. John Smith and Mr. Duane Roderick. Also, present were Mayor Larry Grant, Clerk Treasurer, Joanne Broadwater, and Attorney Jud Barce.

The Junior Council member present was Morgyn Wood.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS:

- **Carnahan made a motion to approve the minutes from February 9th and 16th council meetings, Roderick seconded, all were in favor and the motion passed.**

CITIZENS PETITIONS:

- Leslie Davis spoke about her willingness to participate on city boards and committees.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- None

JUNIOR COUNCIL REPORTS:

- Morgyn Wood mentioned a concerning Facebook post regarding dumped animals. Mayor Grant responded to her concerns.

DEPARTMENT HEADS:

Eric Swank Director of Public Works:

- Had nothing to report.
- Poynter asked about leaf pickup, Swank said they will pick up one more time this spring.
- Carnahan asked if the well has been repaired, Swank the repair is not complete yet.

Police Chief Garret Miller:

- The new police cars are still waiting for equipment to be installed.
- Planned training for all officers is being scheduled.
- Ordinance enforcement is occurring throughout the city.

Fire Chief Mike Little:

- Made a public service announcement about preparing for severe weather.
- Chief Little also stated that the fire department should not be used as a pawn for political gain. The AFD is here to serve the citizens of Attica regardless of politics.

Joanne Broadwater, Clerk-Treasurer:

- The city's Annual Financial Report was uploaded to Indiana Gateway on February 25th, 2026, and is available for the public to view.
- The TIF annual report is due by April 15th, 2026, and is in progress.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Unfinished Business Updates:

- Mayor Grant gave a brief update for WEGA on the downtown market project.
- No annexation updates currently.
- Ambulance relocation – Duke Energy responded that they are not inclined to sell the building East of Attica at this time.

Grant reported a possible location for the new ambulance building would be behind Tractor Supply on a parcel of city owned property. He also reported that the city did not receive grant funding for the ambulance relocation project and will apply again in 2026.

- Grant stated that emergent issues with the current ambulance building will be addressed.
- The council reviewed the revised Paws and Claws contract and made a favorable recommendation to the BOW for approval.

Roderick made a motion to recommend the BOW approve the newest version of the Paws and Claws contract for 2026, Poynter seconded the motion, all were in favor, the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Wabash River Greenway will host an event at Quabache park on Saturday April 25th, 2026.

- Carnahan had no items.


ADJORNMENT:
